Some people of faith question the practice of celebrating Halloween. Here at Weston Christian Church we take the view that this holiday, though it has been influenced by a consumer culture, has deep historic roots in Christian tradition.

The name "Halloween" comes from the All Saints Day celebration of the early Christian church, a day set aside for the solemn remembrance of the martyrs. All Hallows Eve, the evening before All Saints Day, began this time of remembrance. "All Hallows Eve" was eventually contracted to "Hallow-e'en," which became "Halloween."

In the Celtic calendar, it was one of the most important days of the year, representing a midpoint in the year, Samhain, or "summer's end". The Samhain festival (pronounced "sow" "en") celebrated the final harvest, death, and the onset of winter, for three days—October 31 to November 2.

Many scholars agree that the commemoration of saints on November 1 originated in Ireland, spread from there to England, and then to the continent of Europe with the rise of Christianity. By the ninth century, the Roman Catholic Church adopted the Celt's Halloween tradition and Pope Gregory IV sent out an official letter of notification urging that Halloween be observed in harmony with All Saints Day throughout the Roman Empire.

With this historic perspective in mind,

we will be having a Halloween party for all our youth on Sunday, October 22, beginning at 5 p.m.

There will be a Costume Contest, with prizes for the Most Creative and Most Original costumes. Games, food and silliness provided. Please feel free to invite your neighbors, your friends, your grandchildren!

immediate ceasefire, de-escalation of
violence, and the re-opening of humanitarian
assistance into Gaza.
