A note from Cindy...

Romans 8: 1-2. Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and

We are smack-dab in the middle of the Lenten season. Time perhaps to do a bit of a reality check. Why Lent? Why this season of reflection? The larger wisdom of the church speaks to us about the need to constantly take stock of our lives, to pay attention to the places where we get caught, where we get stuck and where we lose sight of the path. For Christians, this path is the life, the death and the resurrection of Christ. And it is important that we pay attention to all three of these realities: the life and teachings of Jesus, his death and all its many implications, and his rising from the dead which continues to speak and to challenge.

Someone recently asked me, "Why do we place so much emphasis on outreach here at WCC?" My immediate thought was that this is the mandate of our Lord - to be His hands and feet in our world. But there is so much more. The writings of Paul affirm again and again that we are set free from all that holds us down (sin, shame and guilt) We are set free by the dying and the rising of Jesus. And it occurs to me that we are set free in order to set others free. When we set down our burdens of guilt and shame, our regrets, our baggage, so to speak, we are able to be more fully present to a world in turmoil. We are more present to those who need a breath of new life.

So Lent is the greening season, which is one of the original meanings of the term "Lent." It is a time of renewal. A time for starting over. It is our time to figure out how to trust the freedom given to us through the dying and rising of Jesus.

This is my humble prayer: a prayer that you are getting free free from all that holds you down, all that holds you back. And when you are living this freedom, others are set free by the light of Christ in you. What joy! What hope for our world!


UPCOMING CHURCH BOARD MEETING


