A Note From Cindy ...

My first real job out of college was at a parish in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The following is a quote from one of the junior high students that I had become close to in my work as the church Youth Director. Her name is Linda Sullivan and she is now a family practice physician in Tulsa, treating people from all walks of life. Linda was an excellent student, but she also gave her parents some reasons to worry - as she rebelled against many of the values and lessons they were hoping to give her. As a youth pastor, I didn't see her as rebellious, but I did see her as someone who wondered a great deal about whether she could make a positive impact in her life. She recently sent me this:

"Today I got to talk with a pair of 80-something married marathon runners, a Vietnam veteran who was shot down twice and still served a full 18 months in combat, a 20 year old working his way though trade school as a server, and a young person who lost 110 pounds in just over a year with lifestyle changes alone. If you despair in humanity, just ask me for a story."

Well, Linda Jane Sullivan, we all struggle sometimes to not give up on the human race. I for one, am deeply grateful for your voice and your stories.

In the past few years, we have asked a few people in our church to get up and share a bit of their story. Each and every time, the response was enthusiastic! People noted that they really had "no idea" about some aspect of this person's life and faith story. Beginning this fall . . . I am going to ask more of you to do the same. What is your faith story and how does it intersect with the choices you have made? We need to hear how you have overcome some obstacle in your life. We especially want to hear you speak about the role of God and the Spirit of Jesus working through you.

So instead of despair, I'm asking you for a story. Start prepar-

Outreach News

A gigantic shout of gratitude for all those who came out to support Micah Ministry on the first Monday of this month. We had

16 individuals representing WCC who also were there to show support for the donation from our church to cover the cost of the meal served that night. A beautiful gift of generosity - from one of our members - and which makes us a huge difference to all those who come for a home cooked meal. The numbers are up considerably from a few years ago, with Micah now serving approximately 1,000 persons each Monday. Please continue to save clothing items (in season only!) They are always especially in need of men's clothing and shoes.

Bristol Manor: We are doing a monthly worship service, sing-along and tea party the first Tuesday of each month. Next opportunity will be on Tuesday September 2, 1:30 p.m. This is a deeply needed and rewarding endeavor.



Birthday Connection: We are partnering with this group to bring birthday presents, a cake and card to youth who are in social services. We deliver these items to several agencies and have received wonderful feedback from both youth and our own volunteers. This commitment takes approximately 3-4 hours and is spread throughout the month. Please see Pastor Cindy if you would like to serve

Hillcrest Platte County: Members of our "Hillcrest Team" have met with the Housing Director from Hillcrest during the summer. We are considering a



larger project to help support their efforts with young adults. Please continue to keep Grace in your prayers, the young woman we are walking with as she navigates her journey to a better life.

Another Hillcrest Success Story...

When Briana first came to HPC, she didn't think she could **succeed.** On day three, she called her case manager and said she was packed and ready to leave. Her ride was waiting outside. Overwhelmed and uncertain, Briana ultimately made the decision to stay and put the work in. That decision shaped everything that came next.

While in the housing program, Briana was able to enroll in classes at UMKC. She began the summer semester and started the path to earn her degree in computer science engineering. Briana also saved thousands of dollars working, and she secured her own rental after graduation.


At graduation, Briana's case manager shared that their connection providentially went back years. She first met Briana when Briana's mom was in another transitional housing program; Briana was a teenager at that time. When Briana's application came through to HPC years later, her case manager recognized her name right away.

"She had to be dragged to the finish line," her case manager later said, not because she didn't want it, but because she carried so much. She was always thinking about everyone else. She just needed someone to walk with her.

Briana also discovered a second connection: another case manager at HPC was her cousin. They hadn't known the other was there, and while her cousin wasn't part of her case, she cheered Briana on from the sidelines. "Briana had her own boutique on North Oak," her cousin said. "She's run a business. She's a gogetter. But life gets hard, and asking for help is even harder. Most people don't. I'm proud of her for that."

At graduation, Briana stood up to speak. "When I came to Hillcrest, my life was different. I didn't know who worked here. Turns out it was my cousin and a case manager I met years ago. It was a double blessing. I thank God for this program, my sponsors, and everyone here. It was hard. I almost gve up. But I made it.

Briana is still growing, and we're proud to be a part of that. Even in the hardest moments, she stayed. She showed up, and she didn't quit.


