Our church is working with other churches and other local folks to open a food pantry here in Weston. The first distribution will be on Nov. 13th from 3-7 p.m. We are also providing volunteers for Harvesters, who come to Weston on the third Friday of each month. This has already been a lot of work from many, many good hearts. Jesus here? YES.

We will soon be delivering and organizing Thanksgiving meals and Christmas gifts for our West Platte families who might be having a rough time right now. Jesus here in all of this? YES.

This is a generous church. You all are amazing in how you give of your time and talent and treasure. Jesus is at work. In you. In us. Everywhere we turn. We've just got to be looking.




### Wednesday Morning Prayer Group

### Outreach

So many good things are happening with this ministry at WCC!

- 1) We have funded gift cards to Aldi's for the recent refugees coming into our country since last January. These gift cards, totaling \$1,000, were delivered to **Della Lamb** Social Services last month. They will aid the South Sudanese family that we helped to resettle as well as several other families who have struggled since State Department funding was cancelled earlier this year.
- 2) We are delivering birthday gifts and a sweet treat through **Birthday Connections** to youth who are living in various social service programs. Birthday Connections is now working with our local Farmer's House to provide baked goods for the program.
- 3) *Micah Ministry*, in downtown KCMO, continues to draw more of our folks into a monthly commitment to serve the working poor and the homeless. We have allocated \$500 to buy clothing and shoes from area thrift stores to help meet the everincreasing needs. We are also collecting cold weather clothing right now from our church members. Next volunteer night is Monday, November 10th.
- 4) Our local **Bristol Manor** is getting more of our attention than ever. On the first Tuesday of each month we have a worship service, sing-a-long, and tea party with the residents. In November we had nine volunteers from WCC who participated!
- 5) Also, locally, we are helping to set up the new **Weston Food Pantry** and ...
- 6) Continue to support *Hillcrest Platte County*. We are still sponsoring one young adult at a time, through the apartments in Platte City. Keep your prayers going for Grace, who has moved on for more intensive support and our new person, Michael, who we are just getting to know. WCC also made a donation through our budgeted Outreach funds for \$2,000 to help buy new mattresses and computer screens for residents who have completed the program.
- 7) **Thanksgiving and Christmas** ~ WCC provides dinner and gifts for many families.
- 8) Outreach also made a \$100 donation to the *LAUGHH Foun-dation* for their annual mission trip to the country of Colombia.



Our 2025-26 season opener plays on the themes of the Psalms of Ascent, a musical pilgrimage. In honor and reflection of this literal pilgrimage of methodically moving upward toward the Temple, we similarly aim to ascend in terms of our understanding and inclusion of a composer who deserves recognition as one of the Baroque era's most innovative artists: Salamone Rossi. Rossi's Jewish identity was a professional impediment in Christian Europe, and his exclusion from the canon of music is an unjust, while predictable, outgrowth of the antisemitism that was prevalent in his lifetime.

The program frames Rossi's work in the context of two of his 17th century colleagues, Monteverdi and Purcell, as well as alongside the indisputable pinnacle of the entire Baroque era: Johann Sebastian Bach. While Monteverdi, Purcell and Bach each held Christian identities, all four of our featured composers lived and worked in environments where religious identity was a basis of social and political exclusion and each experienced it firsthand in some ways.

Natalia faced challenges that would have discouraged many, but instead of giving up, she chose to rise. Through her determination and with the guidance of her case manager and counselor, she paid off thousands of dollars in debt, built a strong emergency fund, and learned the skills needed to sustain her independence.

**Just one week before October graduation, Natalia moved into her very own apartment.** She expressed deep appreciation for the Hillcrest community, sharing that the care, encouragement, and support she received from her case manager, counselor, and staff gave her the tools and hope to start over.
